The narrative should include the gross and net building areas applicable to the project, a description of the major building areas (i.e., operating rooms, laboratories, computer rooms, industrial processes, offices, warehouses) and a brief discussion regarding the following five criteria (if a criterion is not applicable, then state accordingly):

Energy Efficiency	Indoor Air Quality	Innovation
Operation & Maintenance	Cost Effectiveness	

3. Submit your schematic, brief narrative and completed form to me for judging at the Chapter level.

Applicants will receive recognition and have the chance to advance to Regional & Society level competition.
