Chapter Technology Transfer

So Long R-22

December 31, 2009 marked the end of the HCFC refrigerant R-22 in new equipment. The production of new R-22 for servicing existing equipment will be phased out over the next ten years; after that only recovered R-22 will be available. R-22 goes the way of the CFC refrigerants of R-11 and R-12 in the early 90's. Prior to phase out, R-12 sold for approximately \$1/lb and, per one web site, is currently at \$30/lb. (It should be noted that federal excise taxes were added to the price of both of these refrigerants to accelerate their phase out.) R-22 and its apparent replacement, R-410A, are currently at approximately \$8/lb. Who knows where the price of R-22 goes from here other than up? For reference R-134 is slightly less at about \$7/lb.

The next significant step in refrigerant phase out is the controversial disappearance of the HCFC refrigerant R-123 in 2015, a refrigerant whose major fault appears to be its choice of chemical family. R-123 has a 120 GWP (Global Warming Potential) and a 0.012 ODP (Ozone Depletion Potential) as compared to R-134's 1300 GWP and 0 ODP. In 2015 the production of new equipment with R-123 stops; after 2030 only recovered and recycled R-123 will be available.

An article in the December issue of the ASHRAE Journal by Don Gatley discusses the use of "Liquid Sub-Cooling Air Re-Heating" (LSCARH) reheat systems with R-410A. I have used the LSCARH reheat system successfully in the past, with R-22 equipment. The higher operating pressures with R-410A increase both the reheat and cooling effects of this "free" reheat method. It is worth investigating where a little reheat and a modest improvement in moisture removal is desired for humidity control.
